Activities conducted as part of the

MUFG NFUAJ East Japan Earthquake Recovery and Scholarship Fund Program

1. Scholarship Program

There were 1,231 Scholarship Fund Program recipients as of February 22, 2013.

2. Healthy Growth Program

(1) TOMODACHI · MUFG International Exchange Program

For about 2 weeks from July 27, 2012 to August 9 2012, 20 students, including 8 scholarship students and 4 educators from the affected area, travelled to the Southern California, where they learned English during home-stays and classes and participated in local community activities.

(2) Support Event

In December 2012, around 30 scholarship students and their parents or guardians were invited to Charity Soccer 2012, organized by Japan Pro-Footballers Association.

(3) Japan Volleyball League Organization (V League) - Volleyball school

From January 2013 to February 2013, approximately 230 students participated in a Volleyball school supported by V League.

3. Flower-replanting Program

The Flower-replanting Program was held twelve times between May 2012 and November 2012 in Iwate, Miyagi and Fukushima Prefectures. A total of 10,000 plants were donated to 14 elementary, middle and high schools etc. in earthquake-affected regions. The program will continue to be held in the future.

4. Volunteer Program

About 360 executives and other staff from The Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi UFJ and MUFG group companies participated as volunteers in running program 3, listed above.
